Roger Day's original songs expose students to contemporary music in a variety of styles and influences, written with the intent to teach facts about science, nature studies and geography and introduce rich language in a unique, fun and inspiring way. Members of the audience join Roger on his all original, highly-interactive musical journey up and down the Atlantic seacoast, knee deep in squishy, oozy marsh mud, marveling at loggerhead turtles, ghost crabs and other cool coastal residents. The song cycle deals with the importance of habitat and watershed health, the abundance of creatures that depend on water resources and how individuals can help protect the coastal eco-system. This program includes video clips of many of the animals in the songs.

Roger also conducts workshops on teaching skills and content of a preschool through 2nd grade curriculum using the music he has composed and his study guide materials.
